#### **General Event Information**

### What is the Helvellyn Triathlon?

The Helvellyn Triathlon is one of the toughest triathlons in the UK. It includes a 1,500m swim in Ullswater, a 59km bike ride featuring "The Struggle" climb, and a 15km run up and down Helvellyn.

#### When and where does the triathlon take place?

The 2025 event is on Sunday, 7th September, based in Glenridding, Cumbria, with Race HQ located at Jenkins Field.

### Who organises the Helvellyn Triathlon?

The event is organised by The Brownlee Foundation Events (TBF Events), with all profits supporting The Brownlee Foundation.

#### **Registration and Fees**

#### How do I register?

You can register via the official event website. Online registration closes when race capacity is reached.

#### What is the cost of entry?

Entry fees vary by category and include administration fees. Refund policies apply as detailed below.

### Can I get a refund if I can no longer participate?

Refunds are available up to 30 days before the event, following this schedule:

- 100% refund before 7th March 2025
- 50% refund before 7th May 2025
- 25% refund before 7th August 2025

Refund protection is available at registration for additional coverage.

### Can I transfer my entry to someone else or defer to another year?

Transfers to other TBF events are permitted until 12th June 2025. Deferrals are available for pregnancy under certain conditions.



### **Race Preparation**

### What kit do I need?

Mandatory kit includes:

- Swim: Wetsuit (mandatory below 14°C), goggles, swim cap (provided).
- Bike: Helmet, working rear bike light, and basic mechanical kit.
- Run: Fell running shoes, full-body cover, survival blanket, whistle, map, food, and hydration.

### Is there a mandatory safety briefing?

Yes, a safety briefing takes place at 07:45 on race day near the transition area. Attendance is mandatory.

### Are there cut-off times?

Yes, strict cut-off times apply:

- Leave T2 by 13:00
- Reach Red Tarn by 14:30.

### **Race Day Logistics**

### Where do I park?

Parking is at King George V Playing Fields, opening at 06:30 on race day. Parking costs £5, supporting the Playing Fields Charity Fund. There is no parking at Jenkins Field or Glenridding Hotel.

### What are the toilet and changing facilities?

Portable toilets are on-site, with additional public toilets nearby. There are no changing facilities or showers.

### When can I register?

Registration is open on Saturday, 6th September (15:00–18:45) and Sunday, 7th September (06:30–07:30).



## **Race Sections**

# Swim What is the swim course?

A single 1,500m loop in Ullswater. Wetsuits are mandatory below 14°C and optional up to 22°C.

### Can I practise swimming in the lake?

Yes, athletes can swim on Saturday, 6th September, during registration hours at their own risk.

### Bike

## What is the bike course?

The 59km course features "The Struggle," a steep climb with gradients up to 24%. A working rear light is mandatory.

### Is the course closed to traffic?

The course is on open roads. Marshals will indicate the route but cannot stop traffic. The Struggle is notionally closed but may have local traffic.

### Run

### What is the run course?

The 15km route climbs to Helvellyn's summit via Swirral Edge and descends back to Jenkins Field. The terrain includes rocky paths and hands-on scrambling.

## Are there aid stations on the run?

No, participants must carry sufficient food and hydration.

# **Relay Teams and Aquabike**

## Can relay teams participate?

Yes, relay teams are allowed. Timing chips act as batons passed between team members during transitions.

## What is the Aquabike event?

Aquabike participants complete the swim and bike sections. finishing by racking their bike near the finish chute before running to the finish line.



# Spectators

## Can spectators attend?

Yes, spectators are welcome. Key viewing points include Jenkins Field, The Struggle, and Red Tarn.

# Are there facilities for spectators?

Yes, there are public toilets, and food vendors will be present on-site.

# **Post-Race Information**

# What do I receive for finishing?

All finishers receive a medal and goodie bag. Prizes are awarded for the top athletes in individual, relay, and Aquabike categories.

# When will results be available?

Results will be uploaded on the event website after each race.

# Can I purchase photos from the event?

Yes, race photos will be available from Two26 Photography after the event.
